Size 36 - 40 (42 - 44)

Instructions are given for smaller size. Figure in parenthesis refers to larger size. When only one figure is given, it applies to both sizes.

Materials: 100 (125) g of Lana Grossa Più Bella (59% baby alpaca, 20% polyamide, 15% cashmere, 6% Merino wool; 100 m/25 g) in Grey Green (col 8), 75 (100) g in Pink (col 4), 50 (75) g each in Off White (col 1), Mint (col 7), Antique Pink (col 5) and Yellow (col 10). Size 4.5 mm circular needle, 100 cm long; size 3.5 mm needles; size 3.5 mm crochet hook.

Rib patt: K1, p1.


St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Stripe patt 1: 12 rows Grey/Green, 2 rows Off White, 12 rows Antique Pink, 2 rows Off White, 12 rows Mint, 2 rows Off White, 12 rows Pink, 2 rows Off White, 12 rows Yellow, 2 rows Off White = 70 rows. Rep these 70 rows throughout.

Stripe patt 2: 10 rows Grey/Green, [4 rows Pink, 4 rows Grey/Green] 3 times.

Selvage sts: On every row: Knit first and last st.

Gauge: 15 sts and 25 rows = 10 x 10 cm in St st on size 4.5 mm needles.



Back: With size 4.5 mm circular needle and Grey/Green cast on 86 (92) sts. Purl 1 WS row. Working first and last st as selvage sts, work in St st and stripe patt 1 and shape piece as foll: Cast on 6 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 5 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 3 sts at beg of next 6 rows, 2 sts at beg of next 10 rows, 1 st at beg of next 68 (72) rows = 222 (232) sts. Work even until piece meas 47 (48) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape shoulders: At each shoulder edge bind off 4 sts 3 (8) times, 5 sts 15 (12) times. Bind off rem 48 sts.

Front: Work same as back.


Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder/overarm seams. Place markers 10 cm down either side of shoulder line. Sleeve cuffs: With size 3.5 mm needles, Grey/Green and RS facing, pick up and k 36 sts between markers. Work in rib patt and stripe patt 2 for 34 rows = 11 cm. Bind off all sts in rib. Sew cuff seams. Bottom trim, back: With size 4.5 mm circular needle, Off White and RS facing, pick up and k 67 (71) sts along shaped edge, 86 (92) sts along straight bottom edge and 67 (71) sts along opposite shaped edge of back = 220 (234) sts. Knit 1 WS row. Loosely bind off all sts kwise. Rep for bottom trim, front. Neck trim: With size 3.5 mm crochet hook and last col used for body, work 1 rnd sl st around neck edge.



Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
