

Design 32 - Classici 24

# JACKET • SILKHAIR Design 32 - Classici 24 

Size 36/38 (40/42, 44)
Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: $\mathbf{2 2 5} \mathbf{( 2 7 5 , 3 2 5 )} \mathbf{g}$ of Lana Grossa Silkhair (70\% superkid mohair, $30 \%$ silk; $210 \mathrm{~m} / 25 \mathrm{~g}$ ) in Light Grey (col 189). Size 3.5 and 4 mm circular needles, each 40 and 80 cm long; seven 20 mm buttons [by Union Knopf, item 37604, col 12].

Note: Work with 2 strands held tog throughout.

Rib patt: K1, p1.
St st: K on RS, p on WS; k every rnd.
Selvage sts: On every row: Knit first and last st.

Gauge: 19 sts and 26 rows $=10 \times 10 \mathrm{~cm}$ in St st with size 4 mm needles and 2 strands held tog.

Jacket: Worked from the top down. With shorter size 3.5 mm circular needle and 2 strands held tog cast on 109 sts. Next row (WS): Selvage st, * p1, k1; rep from * to last 2 sts, p1, selvage st. Work in rib patt as set by last row until piece meas 3.5 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Change to shorter size 4 mm circular needle. Next RS (inc) row: Selvage st, k15 for right front, M1R, k1 and mark this st, M1R, k16 for right sleeve, M1R, k1 and mark this st, M1R, k41 for back, M1R, k1 and mark this st, M1R, k16 for left sleeve, M1R, k1 and mark this st, M1R, k15 for left front, selvage st $=8$ sts increased and 117 sts total. Rep RS inc row $26(29,32)$ more times, always working incs before and after marked sts = 325 $(349,373)$ sts. Change to longer size 4 mm circular needle as st count increases. Work 1 WS row. Divide for body and sleeves: Next row (RS): Work to end of right front incl marked st, place next $70(76,82)$ sts on hold for sleeve, cast on 3 sts, pm, cast on 3 sts for underarm, work to end of back incl marked sts, place next $70(76,82)$ sts on hold for sleeve, cast on 3 sts, pm, cast on 3 sts for underarm, work to end of left front incl marked st $=197(209,221)$ sts: $97(103,109)$ sts for
back, $44(47,50)$ sts for each front and 6 sts for each underarm. Cont in St st until piece meas 24 cm from divide, ending with a WS row. Change to longer size 3.5 mm circular needle. Work in rib patt for 5 cm , ending with a WS row. Place sts on holder. Sleeves: With shorter size 4 mm circular needle, RS facing and beg at center of underarm, pick up and $k 3$ sts along underarm cast-on, work $70(76,82)$ held sleeve sts, pick up and k 3 sts along underarm cast-on $=76(82,88)$ sts. Place beg of rnd marker and join for working in rnds. Work in St st for $9(6,2)$ rnds. Next dec rnd: K3, k2tog, knit to last 5 sts, skp, k3. Rep dec rnd every $10(7,6)$ th rnd $9(12,15)$ times $=56$ sts. Work even until piece meas 36 cm from underarm, ending with a WS row. Change to shorter size 3.5 mm circular needle. Work in rib patt for 5 cm . Bind off all sts in rib.

Finishing: Pin piece to measurements and block. Left front button band: With size 3.5 mm circular needle and RS facing, pick up and k $97(101,105)$ sts evenly along left front edge. Next row (WS): Selvage st, * p1, k1; rep from * to last 2 sts, p 1 , selvage st. Cont in rib patt as set by last row until band meas 3 cm . Bind off all sts in rib. Right front buttonhole band: With size 3.5 mm circular needle and $R$ facing, pick up and k $97(101,105)$ sts evenly along right front edge. Work same as button band and at same time, when band meas 1.5 cm from pick-up row, work 7 buttonholes on next RS row as foll: For each buttonhole bind off 2 sts. On foll WS row, cast on 2 sts over each set of bound-off sts. Work bottom buttonhole 2 sts up from cast-on edge, rem 6 buttonholes spaced 8 (8.5, 9) cm apart. Bottom ruffle: With longer size 4 mm circular needle and RS facing, pick up and $k 6$ sts along bottom edge of left front button band, sl $197(213,229)$ held body sts to left end of needle and work as foll: P2, k1, * p3, k1; rep from * to last 2 sts, p2, pick up and $k 6$ sts along bottom edge of right front buttonhole band $=209(225,241)$ sts. Next row (WS): Selvage st, k3, p1, k1, work sts as they appear to last 6 sts, k1, p1, k3, selvage st. Next row (RS): Work in rib patt as established, M1R before and after each knit st. Next row (WS): Maintaining selvage sts, work in $3 \times 3$ rib. Next row (RS): Work in rib patt as established, M1R before and after each k3 rib section. Next row (WS): Maintaining selvage sts, work in $3 \times 5$ rib. Bind off all sts in rib. Sew on buttons.

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## Gauge Swatch

## Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. $12 \mathrm{~cm} \times 12 \mathrm{~cm}$. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm . If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
