LANDLUST SOMMERSEIDE

Design 1

PULLOVER



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Size 36/38 (40/42, 44)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Material: For this sweater you need Lana Grossa Landlust Sommerseide **300 (350, 400) g** (50% silk, 50% cotton; 170 m/50 g) in Grey-Green **(col 5)**. 1 each of circular knitting needles size 4, 40, 60 and 80 cm long and 1 double pointed needles size 4.

St st in rds: k each rd.

Gauge: St st with size 4 needles: 22 sts and 31 rows = 10 x 10cm.

NOTE: The whole sweater is knitted top down in one piece in rounds. You start at the neckline.

Instructions: Cast on 120 (128 – 135) sts with circular knitting needle no. 4, 40 cm long. Close the work to round and mark the beginning of the round. St. st. After 5 cm, = rolled edge, k 1 rd more, doing 8 x after every 15th st (16 x after every 8th st - 9 x after every 15th st) inc. k 1 twisted from the cross-thread = 128 (144 – 144) sts. Inc for round yoke as follows. and gradually switch to the longer circular knitting needle: 1st round: After every 8th st from the cross thread, $k \mid k \mid twisted = 32 (36 - 36)$ sts inc = 160 (180 – 180) sts. 13th (13th – 11th) round: After each 10th st, or between the last inc st, from the cross-thread K 1, K 1 twisted = 32 (36 - 36) sts inc = 192 (216 - 216) sts. 25th (25th - 21st) round: After every 12th st, or between the last inc st, from the cross-thread K 1, K 1 twisted = 32 (36 - 36) sts inc = 224 (252 - 252) sts. 37th (37th - 31st) round: After every 14th st, or between the last inc st, from the cross-thread K 1, K 1 twisted = 32 (36 - 36) sts inc = 256 (288 - 288) sts. 49th (49th - 41st) round: After every 16th st, or between the last inc sts, from the crossthread K 1, K 1 twisted = 32 (36 - 36) sts inc = 288 (324 - 324)

sts. only size 44: 51st round: After every 18th st, or between the last inc sts, from the cross-thread K 1, K 1 twisted = 36 sts inc = 360 sts. Continue without increases. After 19 (20-21) cm round yoke, = 58 (62-66) rounds, divide the work from the beginning of the round as follows: 91 (101-111) sts back, 53 (61-69) sts 1st sleeve, 91 (101st-111) sts front, 53 (61-69) sts 2nd sleeve. Put the sts of the sleeves on hold.


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Front and back: Take the sts from the front and back on circular knitting needle no. 4, 80 cm long and cast on 21 (21 – 23) sts between each piece = 224 (244 - 268) sts. Work in St st in rds . After 35 (34 - 34) cm from the round yoke, knit 2 more rows p, then bind off all sts.

Sleeves: Divide the 53 (61 - 69) sts of the 1st sleeve on the double pointed needles size 4 and pick up 21 (21 - 23) sts from the sts cast on between the back and front = 74 (82 - 92) sts. In rds St st. For the sleeve shape, within the 21 (21 - 23) sts the middle mark 3 sts. In the following 10th round before the 3 marked sts, k2tog, knit the 3 marked sts, then skp (= slip st, k the following sts, pass slipped stitch over knitted st) = 72 (80 - 90) sts. Repeat dec every 12th round 7 more times (repeat every 8th round 11 times – every 6th round 16 more times) = 58 sts. Continue straight. After 42 cm from the round yoke or the desired sleeve length, knit 2 more rows p to finish, then bind off all sts. Work the 2nd sleeve in the same way.

Finishing: Stretch the sweater, moisten and let dry.



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GAUGE SWATCH

Before you begin knitting...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast on and bind off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
