COAT



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Size 36/38 (40/42, 44/46) Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 300 (325, 350) g of Lana Grossa **Silkhair** (70% superkid mohair, 30% silk; 210 m/25 g) in Mint **(col 175)**. Size 6 mm needles.

Note: Work with 2 strands held tog throughout.

Selvage stitches: On every row: SI first st kwise, k last st.

Rib patt: K1, p1.

St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Rev St st: P on RS, k on WS.

Full-fashion decrease: At beg of RS row, selvage st, 28 sts in rev St st, 1 st in St st, k2tog; at end of RS row, work to last 32 sts, skp, 1 st in St st, 28 sts in rev St st, selvage st.

Gauges: With size 6 mm needles and 2 strands held tog: 14 sts and 20 rows = 10×10 cm in St st and rev St st; 17 sts and 20 rows = 10×10 cm in rib patt.

Back: With size 6 mm needles and 2 strands held tog cast on 84 (90, 96) sts. Beg and end with a WS row and working first and last st as selvage sts, work in rib patt for 3 rows and piece meas 1.5 cm from cast-on. Maintaining selvage sts, work in St st for 69 (68, 67) cm. Place marker in first and last st on last WS row to indicate beg of armholes. Cont until piece meas 18 (19, 20) cm from armhole markers, ending with a WS row. Shape shoulders: At each shoulder edge bind off 7 sts 2 times, 6 sts 3 times (7 sts 5 times / 8 sts 3 times, 7 sts 2 times). Bind off rem 20 sts.

Left front: With size 6 mm needles and 2 strands held tog cast on 68 (71, 74) sts. Beg and end with a WS row and working first and last st as selvage sts, work in rib patt for 3 rows and piece meas 1.5 cm from cast-on. Next row (RS): Selvage st, 38 (41, 44) sts in St st, 28 sts in rev St st, selvage st. Work in patt as set by last row until piece meas 60 cm from end of rib patt, ending with a WS row. Shape neck: Working full-fashion dec, dec 1 st at end of next RS row, then every 10th row 6 times = 61 (64, 67) sts. At same time, when same length as back to armhole, place armhole marker at right edge and when same length as back to shoulder, shape shoulder at right edge same as for back = 29 sts rem for collar. Cast on 1 st at right edge of collar (work as selvage st throughout) = 30 sts for collar and cont in patt for 7 cm, ending with a WS row. Place sts on holder.

Right front: Work same as left front, reversing all shaping and patt placement.

Sleeves: With size 6 mm needles and 2 strands held tog cast on 36 (39, 42) sts. Beg and end with a WS row and working first


and last st as selvage sts, work in rib patt for 21 rows and piece meas 10 cm from cast-on. Maintaining selvage sts, work in St st for 20 cm, ending with a WS row. Shape sleeve: Inc 1 st at each end of next RS row, then every 6th row 6 times = 50 (53, 56) sts. Work even until piece meas 52 cm from end of rib patt. Bind off all sts.

Pockets: Make 2. With size 6 mm needles cast on 29 sts. Working first and last st as selvage sts, work in rib patt until piece meas 18 cm from cast-on. Bind off all sts in rib.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Referring to schematic for placement, sew pockets to fronts. Sew shoulder seams. Graft left and right collar tog, then sew collar to back neck. Sew on sleeves between markers. Sew side and sleeve seams.

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GAUGE SWATCH

Before you begin knitting...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast on and bind off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
